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activate.HCAExplorer *Activate projects, samples, or files to display in the HCAExplorer Object*

Description

The HCAExplorer can display its results in a variety of ways. Choose whether to display entries by project, samples, or files. The HCAExplorer class always defaults to projects.

Usage

```
## S3 method for class 'HCAExplorer'
activate(.data, what = c("projects", "samples",
  "files"))
```

Arguments

.data An HCAExplorer object
 what character(1). Either 'projects', 'samples', or 'files'.

Value

An HCAExplorer object with modified activation.

Description

This function is used to discover possible fields that can be queried upon in an HCAExplorer object.

Usage

```
## S4 method for signature 'HCAExplorer'
fields(x)
```

Arguments

x An HCAExplorer object.

Value

A tibble indicating fields that can be queried upon.

Description

Given some amount of fields and values associated with them, modify the search performed by the HCAExplorer object. This function adds terms to the query that is ultimately performed.

Usage

```
## S3 method for class 'HCAExplorer'
filter(.data, ..., .preserve)
```

Arguments

.data	An HCAExplorer object to query.
...	Any number of fields and values to queried against. The binary operators '==' and '&' is allowed. See examples.
.preserve	Unused argument

Value

An HCAExplorer object with the desired query performed.

Obtain metadata information from an HCAExplorer object

Description

Obtain metadata information from an HCAExplorer object. This metadata can then be passed on to download files from other services.

Usage

```
## S4 method for signature 'HCAExplorer'
getManifest(x, fileFormat)
```

Arguments

x	An HCAExplorer object
fileFormat	character. A character vector of file formats of metadata to obtain. The possible arguments can be found using the getManifestFileFormats method.

Value

a tibble of metadata information.

Description

Reset all queries performed on an HCAExplorer object then return the result.

Description

Returns a tibble either showing bundles or files based on whichever is activated. The tibble returned will display the full results of the search instead of the attenuated table shows when displaying the HCAExplorer object.

results(x)
```

x An HCAExplorer object.

a tibble giving the unattenuated search results of the HCAExplorer object.

Description

An HCAExplorer object is initiated with certain default columns being displayed upon showing the object. This method allows a user to display columns other than the default columns when displaying the object.

Usage

```
## S3 method for class 'HCAExplorer'  
select(.data, ...)
```

Arguments

.data An HCAObject to filter.
... Columns to be displayed.

Value

An HCAExplorer object with the applied filter.

<code>n</code>	integer(1). The number of queries to step back from.

An HCAExplorer object with the changes applied to it.

values(x, fields)
```

Arguments

x	An HCAExplorer Object.
fields	A character vector of fields to display available values for.
...	Unused arguments.

Value

a character vector of possible values for a filter.

Description

Returns a list of all the metadata from the current selection of entries in the HCAExplorer object as a projectView object. This method is is meant to return a clear and useful representation of the metadata of a selection of projects.

```

x An HCAExplorer object

Value

A list of all metadata in the selected entries. This list will contain mulitple lists representing the metadata.

[,HCAExplorer-method *Subset an HCAExplorer Object by row number or project name*

Description

Allows subsetting an HCAExplorer object by row number or project name. This method internally acts as a filter and actually performs a query using "projectIds".

Usage

```
## S4 method for signature 'HCAExplorer'  
x[i, j, ..., drop = TRUE]
```

Arguments

x	An HCAExplorer object.
i	Either a numeric vector indicating which rows to choose or a character vector of project titles indicating which projects to choose.
j	Unused argument.
...	Unused argument.
drop	Unused argument.

Value

An HCAExplorer object with the applied subset.
